

What are your choices at this election?

The shame of Mac Shane

If someone claimed that a race of people had 'got a dark streak of xenophobia and racism in their mentality' you would expect them to be condemned from all sides. Imagine that being said about Muslims..!

It is OK for Labour to say it, of course. In an interview in the Daily Telegraph last year, Labour's Europe Minister, Denis MacShane, said the British people collectively 'have got a dark streak of xenophobia and racism in our mentality' and that we 'validate a kind of Orwellian hate language against other European countries'.

This illustrates the standard method by which the Europhiles treat any opposition to their EU dream. It is the type of tactic that is sure to be repeated in their desperation to secure a 'Yes' vote in the EU Constitution referendum next year.

The way EU law is applied - 9th March 2005

On this date MPs in the House of Commons committee that is supposed to check new EU law (before it passed 'on the nod' by Westminster into UK law) were presented with a bundle of highly technical documents no less than 900 pages long which they had to approve in less than two hours. To make things more entertaining, some of the documents came in a variety of foreign languages. One member went on record to say 'we are expected to note the documents, , we can pretend to have done, and to approve the Government's policies ... What we are doing here is farcical. We are rubber-stamping something has long been passed..' Basically because the actual policy was hammered out between bureaucrats at a three day conference and it is just presented to the MPs to give it the illusion of democratic legitimacy !! This is the reality behind the 70% of new UK law that comes from the EU.

Hidden Law!

The government is very wary of admitting to the EU origin of much new law, so it either plays it down or tries to anticipate it so that it can claim it is home grown. Devolution/Regionalisation is an obvious one. Regionalisation was originally forced on John Major's Conservatives by the EU making it a condition of receiving some of our money back in the form of EU grants. John Prescott claimed that it was his idea. Other examples are the abolition of trial by jury. The proposed, EU wide, judicial system 'Corpus Juris' does not use Trial by Jury so all attempts possible are being made to limit it. The proposed EU Army has a larger unit size than the typical British Army unit so the recent unit reorganisation announced by Labour has resulted in? You guessed it! Larger units! The list goes on..

Did You Know?

Figures from the European Central Bank demonstrate why Britain has nothing to lose in negotiating a new trade only relationship with Europe.

The ECB 12 month report to Sept 2004 shows that the exports and imports of countries using the Euro to the following countries were as follows:

	<i>Exports</i>	<i>Imports</i>	<i>Trade Balance</i>
UK	20%	17%	- 3%
The rest of the world	80%	83%	+ 3%

Basically the Euro countries export considerably more to us than we import from them (the 3% difference above adds up to about £150 billion over the last decade. That is £150 billion more the other EU countries have sold to us than we have sold to them). They really are not going to risk the sales of all those cars and bottles of wine, etc. by starting a trade war because we left the EU. Even Neil Kinnock, the UK's former EU Commissioner conceded on the Radio 4 'Today' program last year, that not one British job would be lost if we pulled out of the EU. The reality is that the UK's membership of the EU **costs us jobs**. Every survey ever done has shown that the EU costs us £10s billions each year in red tape and trade restrictions.

The EU gives its police 'life time' immunity from prosecution for any crimes committed while they are employed by the EU

In fact the EU gives this to all its employees. It is bad enough giving it to bureaucrats (is it any wonder there is so much corruption?) but to give it to the police as well beggars belief. It doesn't end there either. Additionally the **'..premises and buildings of the Communities shall be exempt from search, requisition, confiscation or expropriation, and their archives shall be inviolable..'** (from the Protocol on the Privileges and Immunities of the EU). So their premises are also totally beyond and above the law.

We pay the EU £33 million in fees every day of every year just for the privilege of being a member state!

That is about £11 billion pounds a year. You can buy a lot of hospitals for that.. Or massively increase the state pension. Or employ more teachers or police than you could ever need... or... or ...
